

Documents to bring to your appointment with Legal Aid Society of San Diego:

<p>Naturalization applicants</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Your permanent resident alien card</li> <li>2. Completed Naturalization Preparation Packet</li> <li>3. If you have changed your name since becoming a permanent resident, documents showing the legal name change (e.g. marriage certificate, divorce decree, court order)</li> <li>4. Court information relating to any criminal history</li> </ol> <p>If you will be requesting a fee waiver for your application, please also bring the following (where applicable) (a) proof you receive public assistance (such as food stamps, SSI, etc) <i>or</i> (b) most recent year's federal tax returns plus paycheck stubs for last 30 days for all members of your household</p>
<p>Replacement/renewal of permanent resident card applicants</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Your permanent resident alien card</li> <li>2. Completed Permanent Resident Card Renewal Preparation Packet</li> <li>3. If your current legal name is different than that on your permanent resident card, bring documents showing the legal name change (e.g. marriage certificate, divorce decree, court order)</li> <li>4. Court information relating to any criminal history</li> </ol> <p>If you will be requesting a fee waiver for your application, please also bring the following (where applicable) (a) proof you receive public assistance (such as food stamps, SSI, etc) <i>or</i> (b) most recent year's federal tax returns plus paycheck stubs for last 30 days for all members of your household</p>
<p>Family based petitioners</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Proof you are a U.S. citizen or your permanent resident alien card</li> <li>2. Proof of your relationship to the person you would like to immigrate (e.g. marriage certificate plus proof of termination of all prior marriages if immigrating your spouse; birth certificate if you are immigrating your child or your parent; birth certificate of you and your sibling if you are immigrating your sibling; etc.)</li> </ol>
<p>VAWA self-petitioners</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Proof of your relationship to your abuser (e.g. marriage certificate plus proof of termination of all prior marriages if abuser is spouse; birth certificate if abuser is parent or child)</li> <li>2. Proof of the permanent resident alien or U.S. citizen status of the abuser</li> <li>3. Proof you lived with the abuser</li> <li>4. Any police or hospital records which tend to show the abuse</li> <li>5. Any restraining order(s) which you may have against your abuser</li> </ol>
<p>Victims of violent crimes who have been cooperative with law enforcement officials</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Proof that you have been the victim of a crime (e.g. police report or hospital records)</li> <li>2. Proof you have been cooperative with a law enforcement agency (e.g. police report, court documents)</li> </ol>
<p>Victims of human trafficking</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Proof that you have been the victim of trafficking (e.g. police reports, newspaper articles, witness affidavits, etc.)</li> <li>2. Proof that you have complied with any reasonable request to cooperate with any law enforcement agency in connection with the trafficking</li> </ol>
