# Lieut. Whitacre Named Public Attorney, Office Created by Will of Lieut. Dewitt Mitchell

Fund of \$20,000 in Trust for Maintenance of Service to Be Free to People.

**L**IEUT. P. A. WHITACRE has been appointed by the Bar association of San Diego to fill the place of public attorney, created by the will of Lieut. DeWitt C. Mitchell. Lieutenant Whitacre, who is just out of the air service of the U. S. army, has opened offices at 548 Spreckels building. He had three clients waiting for his services when he received the appointment.

Lieutenant Mitchell left a fund of \$20,000 to the president and cashier of the First National bank of San Diego, in trust, to be held and invested by them and the proceeds given to the Bar association to employ an attorney to fill the office which he had created.

At the time of his death Lieutenant Mitchell was a first lieutenant in the national army and a member of the staff of Brigadier General O'Neil at Camp Travis, Tex.

Lieutenant Whitacre, who has received the appointment to the office created by Lieutenant Mitchell, was a first lieutenant in the air service. He is a graduate of the University of Kentucky, where he received the degree of L. L. B. He is a young man of sterling qualities and is a member of the University club.

## Gives Law Library

Desiring to carry out the wishes of her son, Mrs. Bertha B. Mitchell has given his complete law library to the office which he created and, in addition, has donated money to pay for the offices and \$100 a month salary, until funds are available from the trust.

That there is a great need of a public attorney in San Diego is evidenced, it is declared, by three clients being on the waiting list before the appointment was made by the Bar association.

Lieutenant Mitchell's will requires that the person filling the office of public attorney shall be annually selected by the Bar association of San Diego, by competitive written examination. Some time ago the Bar association adopted a by-law accepting the trust created by the will, authorizing its judiciary committee to conduct the examination required by the will and report a candidate or candidates to the association for appointment to the office of public attorney under the will. Mr. Whitacre has passed the examination and has been appointed to fill the place for the coming year.

#### Terms of Will

By the terms of the will the person holding the office of public attorney thereunder is required to advertise in a reasonable manner that he holds the position of public attorney, the location of his office, together with his daily office hours. He must devote his whole time to the performance of his duties as public attorney and not engage in any other legal work. He is prohibited from accepting any fee or emolument, except the salary provided for by the will, for doing the work of public attorney, and the will further provides that he shall not engage in prosecuting or defending matters of a criminal nature or in the conduct of defense of divorce or annulment suits, but shall confine his services to matters of a civil nature. All persons who shall be without present means or funds to employ or pay an attorney are made the beneficiaries of the trust.

The Bar association of San Diego is taking a very active interest in the administration of this trust. Lieutenant Mitchell has been highly commended by the leading members of the Bar association of San Diego, as well as by men prominent in business and professional circles elsewhere for his thoughtfulness and foresight in creating an office which is bound to be productive of great good to the beneficiaries thereof.
